“Revisiting the Idea of a Godless Constitution”

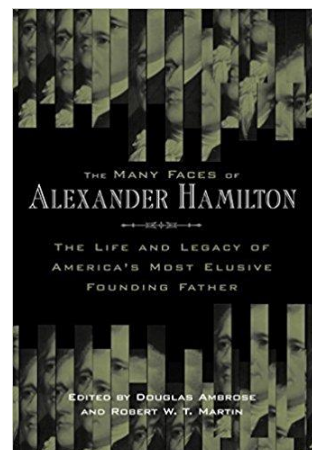
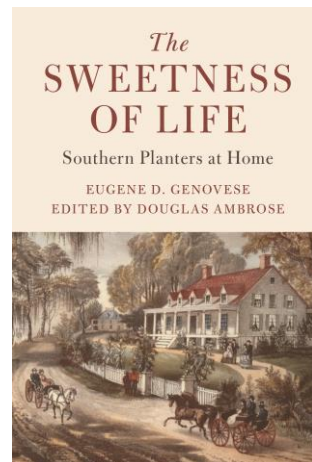
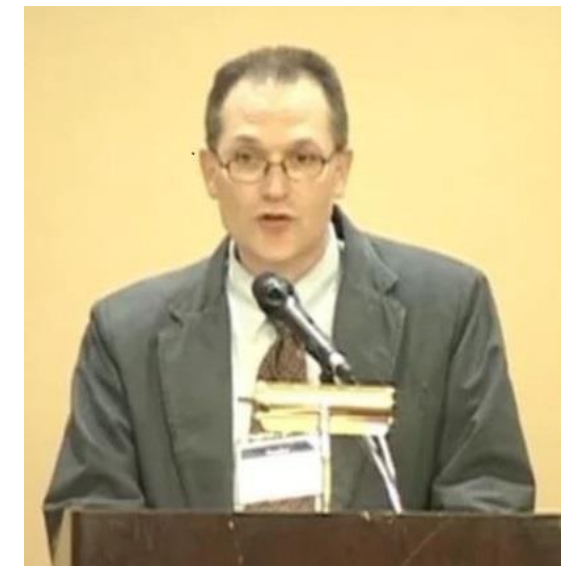

He served with distinction as a federal judge from 1985 to 2006 on the United States Court of Appeals for the Sixth Circuit.
